Experimental Cocktail Club

Step into a "un joyeux bordel," or a merry mess, in this Parisian import inspired by NYC's craft cocktail scene. Conjuring 1920s Paris, this spot from Frenchmen Romée de Goriainoff, Olivier Bon, and Pierre-Charles Cros is decked out with low-hanging lamps and vintage Hindustan wall murals. DJs spin jazz and funk while bartenders mix everything from Buffalo Trace bourbon to exotic Indonesian rum Batavia arrack.

or the Oscar Mike (an old-fashioned with honey).

Order up the \$26 Black Label burger at this revival hotspot from Keith McNally situated in a corner space on MacDougal Street. This West Village pub first opened in 1937, attracting neighborhood layabouts and hangers-on, from Ernest Hemingway and Ezra Pound to E. E. Cummings and Dylan Thomas. Checkerboard floors and silhouette cutouts from the '30s add to the stylishly au courant feel.

Share vodka shots with performers who blur the lines between audience and cast.



The Tippler

Head to the lower level of the Chelsea Market for an underground space run by Paul Tanguay and Tad Carducci, or The Tippling Brothers. Channeling a bygone era, the set-like space features brick archways and castiron fixtures, oriental rugs, and playful Sistine Chapel knockoffs complemented by an old-timey menu. Try inventive drinks like The Crippler composed of rye, rum, and BBQ bitters, or The Screaming Greenie.

Dine on Public veteran Tae Strain's inventive menu and cocktails by Aaron Polsky amid crystal chandeliers, overstuffed leather couches, Corinthian columns, and a bar made of glowing blue glass Try the Denver lamb loin or Long Island duck breast and finish with pastry creations from a former EMP staffer.

Party in the pinnacle of the Meatpacking's glittering nightlife district at Andre Balazs' hotel club, which opened four years ago with a bang: Some likened the celebrity-studded scene to the heydays of Studio 54. Take in jaw-dropping views from one of the city's most well-designed rooms—if you can land a spot on the curated guest list. (Otherwise, there's always Le Bain next door.)

Tucked on East 69th Street just off of Madison Avenue, this third-floor boutique spans two floors—reaching to the fifth story. Channeling French concept shop Colette, the bi-level retail space fuses buzzy designers, like Preen and Suno with traditional tailoring and luxurious Loro Piana cashmere. Double-distilled old New York, there's a "who's who" mural of the Jazz Age by Ed Sorel, as well as Charlie Wala's famous 1950s monkey mural of chimps shaking up banana daiquiris. Try one of the experimental cocktails, like the Chinatown daiquiri spiced with Sriracha sauce.
